# BYLAW A-2

# A BYLAW OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF THE VILLAGE OF BATH RESPECTING THE COMPOSITION OF THE COUNCIL AND THE RENUMERATION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCILLORS

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BATH AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Council of the Village of Bath consists of a mayor, a deputy mayor, and two councilors.
- 2. The deputy mayor is elected by the councilors at the first meeting of the new council.
- 3. The annual salary to the Mayor of the Village is set out in Schedule "A".
- 4. The annual salary of the Deputy Mayor is set out in Schedule "A".
- 5. The annual salary to each Councillor is set out in Schedule "A".
- 6. An expense allowance will be allowed as set out in Schedule "B".
- 7. A pension allowance will be allowed as set out in Schedule "C".
- 8. All expenses must have approval by a majority vote of the Council for authorization of payment immediately after such expense has been incurred.

Bylaw No. 2, A Bylaw Respecting the Composition of the Council and the Renumeration of the Mayor and Councillors passed on December 8, 1997 is hereby repealed.

#### Mayor's Salary

Effective January 1, 2005

#### **Council Member Salary**

Effective January 1, 2005

Two Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$2700.00)

## **SCHEDULE "B"**

Personal Vehicle Per Kilometer \$.50

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner, as submitted, but not to exceed !100.00 per day/person.

Hotel Accomodations as submitted.

#### **SCHEDULE "C"**

A per diem rate of \$50.00 per meeting per person will be paid to Mayor, Deputy Mayor and Council Members, for any meeting held outside the Village of Bath while attending village business. This does not include attendance to functions where, Mayor, Deputy Mayor or Council Members are invited, and village business would not normally occur. Examples are to dinner functions, political meetings and similar.
