Department and Committee Reports:

Legal, Finance and Administration: Clerk attended a meeting for the local clerks in Perth last week. One thing discussed was the tax sale by the province on a property within the municipality. The Lions members should be included in this discussion also. There were many renovations to the booths at the fairgrounds this year. The banners that were made can be used again next year.

<u>Community Development:</u> There has been an increase in four wheelers on the trail as noted by Coun McIntosh. Brennans has contacted Ms. O'Donnell about ordering red/white tulips for next year's celebration of the 150yh Birthday of Canada. Mr. Hargrove has cleaned his property along the riverbank by the lookout.

<u>Recreation Committee:</u> Coun O'Neill discussed the issue of the pool closing early this year. All the staff were returning to school early and there was no one to staff public swim. Had a meeting with the LSD reps about recreation which was very positive. Letter to go out to minister regarding the tax increase for LSD's to help pay for recreation. This will go to a vote in the fall.
